







Year 3


In PSHE this week Year 3 looked at the different jobs people can have and the children shared what they would like to do when they are older. The jobs ranged from tennis player to doctor and artist to fashion designer.





Year 4

In Science the past two weeks, we have been discussing food chains and food webs. Last Friday, we created several food chains using cuddly toys (no toys were harmed in creating the chains) as a year group. We talked about who were the producers, consumers, predators and prey. We also discussed whether they were herbivores, omnivores and carnivores linking our work back to our non-chronological reports where we discussed animal teeth. Then on Wednesday this week, we developed some of our food chains into food webs trying to discuss who would eat who and whether certain animals would be able to eat others if they are in different habitats. The children then enjoyed creating food webs using purple mash and 2 connect- it was quite a hard, fiddly task but all the children persevered.



Year 5

In Science this week, year 5 had a boat race! We talked about water resistance and tried to create a streamlined boat to race through the water. We found the boats which were quickest had a pointed nose and tail. We battled within classes then had a final between 5A and 5B. Well done to our overall winner Julia S whose streamlined boat prevailed!











Year 6

In science this week, the children continued their learning of light and looked at reflection. They made their own periscopes to see how reflection can change the path of light rays.







Year 6 have worked so hard this week with their practice SATs: they should be very proud of themselves. With only a few weeks when we return after Easter, it is important that they continue to do some practice over the holidays. Your child has been given a pack with some practice papers in and work they can complete over the break. It is also important that they take some time to rest in the holidays too!


Reading tips

Reading helps your child's wellbeing, develops imagination and has educational benefits too. Just a few minutes a day can have a big impact on children of all ages.


2. Read aloud regularly
