### Nursery

This week in Nursery we have been learning about flowers. We have been doing observational drawings of daffodils. On Tuesday we went to the big school field to plant our own seeds. We scattered the seeds across the field.







### **Reception**

This week we have had some very exciting visitors to our Reception classes. This half-term we are learning about growing and life cycles and we have been looking after some tiny caterpillars. We are watching as the caterpillars begin to grow and we can't wait until they create their chrysalis and then turn in to a beautiful butterfly! This week in science, we have been learning about the weather focusing on rain. We created our own rain gauges using plastic bottles and have attached them to the fence outside our classrooms. Each afternoon, at the same time, we are going to measure the amount of rainfall and use this data to create a graph.

We have enjoyed our fictional Literacy and Reading text 'The Lost Happy Endings' by Carol Ann Duffy. We have created dialogue sequences, participated in thought tapping drama, acted out suspenseful scenes and developed short role play videos on iPads.



### Year 4

As part of our school drive on outdoor learning, mental health and wellbeing, Mrs Dean, in collaboration with The Wild Life Trust, arranged for us to scatter seeds on the field to create what will become a meadow area.



### Year 5

This morning, we spent time with Chip Kendall in an RE/Music workshop. This was connected to our learning about the meaning of Easter for Christians and how salvation is a key focus during this time. The children enjoyed this workshop. Well done Year 5.







### Year 6

Last Tuesday, Year 6 were very lucky to have a special visitor. Emily Hall is a doctor at Leighton Hospital and gave up one of her days off to talk to the children about the human heart. As you can see from the images, the heart dissection was a real eye opener where the children discovered many things. Here's what they had to say about it:

- The fat felt stone hard, so that tells me that eating too much fat must be bad for us.
  - It was heavier than I thought—I didn't realise that muscle would be so heavy.
- The aorta was rubbery and tough—that's because it needs to be robust to keep the blood constantly pumping.
- I wasn't expecting there to be so many different textures within one organ.


