#### **The Hub**

The Hub children have combined Art, handwriting and the Easter theme this week by making easter cards for their families. While creating the bodies of our chicks, some of the children were able to identify that they were using circles, triangles and soft feathers.







#### Nursery

In Nursery we have been exploring 2D shapes. First we matched and sorted the shapes. Then we used paint to print different coloured shapes. Nursery have been working hard to learn the 2D shape names and to discuss their properties.







Reception

This week we have been learning about minibeasts and the children have made their own worm hotels. We discussed how the worms wiggle and dig tunnels in the soil. The children have enjoyed observing the worms in their new habitat.







To introduce our new topic for next half term, we went on a visit to Delamere Forest. Our new topic is called 'All about growing' and we completed two activities run by rangers at the forest; Amazing Forests and Shelter Building. We had an amazing day!











#### Year 2

Last week, year 2 enjoyed a visit from Medic Fest. We explored lots of different medical equipment and got to try some out ourselves.







On Thursday, we continued our learning on mass looking at adding and subtracting mass. We used active maths of 'weight hunt' to consolidate our learning.













#### Year 4

For the past five weeks Year 4 have been practicing songs to participate in the Singfest celebration, that took place in Congleton Town Hall. The children were brilliantly behaved and gave a fantastic performance even though the nerves were high in front of a large audience. They are a credit to Wistaston Academy! This half term the children in Year 5 have been focusing on careers and aspirations in PSHE. We have explored careers of interest and considered what qualifications, skills and attributes are necessary for those aspirations. We were able to visit Cheshire College to explore what they have to offer young people which left many children enthused and excited about the opportunities and facilities available to them as young adults.

Last week, the children across UKS2, were able to take part in MedicFest, which also supported our learning in PSHE. The children learnt a lot about the NHS, practices and procedures undertaken by doctors, nurses and medical staff and thoroughly enjoyed the day.

It has been wonderful watching the children learn, explore and develop their understanding of the exciting possibilities and opportunities available to them in the future.





In Science this week, we have explored and investigated refraction in different situations. We did 6 different experiments. Here are 3 of our favourites:

- 1. We created a Newton wheel to try to turn the colours of the rainbow in to white light.
- 2. We made images disappear using refraction through water.
- 3. We explored bubbles! We looked closely at bubbles and discovered the different colours refracted from bubbles.


