#### **The Hub**

Looking after ourselves and staying healthy is The Hub's topic for this half-term. We have begun this by learning about the importance of cleaning our teeth. The children were able to look at a model of some teeth before exploring their own using mirrors. All of the children were given the opportunity to practise brushing their own teeth to see how shiny and white they could make them.









#### Nursery

This week in Nursery some very special visitors arrived... The chicks! The children have really enjoyed observing the eggs and talking about what they think will happen once they hatch. Throughout the week we have been learning all about the life cycle of a chick and how we can take care of the chicks once the eggs have hatched.







## Reception

This week in Reception we have been learning about sun safety and keeping ourselves safe while outside in the sun. We've been making sure we are drinking a whole bottle of water – if not more! Throughout the week, the children have been chatting about what they already know about sun safety and then we explored why we need to keep safe – sun cream to stop us from burning, sun glasses to protect our eyes, sun hat for our heads and lots of water to keep us hydrated. We are now Sun Safety Superstars!







## Year 1

This week in Year 1, we are continuing with our topic 'Amazing Animals' and have been looking closely at reptiles. We have learnt some interesting facts about snakes and the children have all enjoyed making their own coiled snake, detailing their favourite facts.









#### Year 2

This week, Year 2 created block diagrams to show the favourite fruit in Year 2.









Year 3

This week, year 3 continued their Science topic of Space. We looked at the science behind rockets and then completed an investigation to see how far the rocket travels with adaptations. We completed a post note investigation and decided we were changing how long the straw was to see how this impacted on how far the rocket went.



#### Year 4

In Science, we investigated what bubbles are and how we can make bubbles by experimenting with different solutions. We have made predictions to see how could we improve our bubble mixture and make 'best bubbles'. Finally, we created our own bubble wand to see if we could alter the shape of a bubble but we found out that all bubbles are spherical.



#### Year 5

This week, Year 5 have started their learning in literacy and Geography about the Amazon rainforest. We have identified where the rainforest is, explored the climate and characteristics, considered the benefits of the Amazon and discussed the devastating effects of deforestation and climate change. The children will be using all of this learning to write a persuasive speech later in the term about why the Amazon rainforest should be protected.

#### Year 6

On Tuesday, Year 6 continued their STEM project with a visit from the construction company, ISG. The children discussed the variety of roles that there are on a construction site: from planners to carpenters and electricians. We were told about the construction of the new fire station in Crewe and Abby (a construction planner) explained how she came in to her role within construction.

The children were then tasked with building a tower, as tall as they could which would stand for at least 10 seconds. They used art straws, tape and blue tack to create their construction of a tower. The tallest tower in 6A was 5 feet 10 inches!

## **National School Sports Week 2023**
