

#### <u>The Hub</u>

During our Science and Technology lesson this week, the children got to work with a little robot. The robot has a sensor underneath which it uses light to detect dark lines on white paper and follow them. 







#### **Reception**


#### Year 3



## ICON Week 2023: Raising awareness of infant crying and how to cope.

#### About ICON

The idea for the ICON programme and the different interventions within it was conceived by Dr Suzanne Smith PhD following a Winston Churchill Memorial Trust Travel Fellowship to the USA and Canada in 2016 which included the study of effective interventions and research into the prevention of Abusive Head Trauma (AHT). Research suggests that some lose control when a baby's crying becomes too much. Some go on to shake a baby with devastating consequences.

Suzanne found that the most effective evidence-based programmes studied provide a simple message that supports parents/caregivers to cope with infant crying. Apart from preventing AHT, most people who have ever cared for a baby appreciate some advice about comforting a crying baby and coping when it goes on for a long time.

ICON is about helping people caring for babies cope with crying.

#### ICON stands for

Infant crying is normal! Every baby is different and crying can last between 1 to 5 hours

Comforting methods can sometimes sooth the baby and the crying will stop. Try gently rocking baby or singing a lullaby.

It's OK to walk away. Put baby somewhere safe and take some time out.

- Speak to someone if you need support such as family, friends, midwife, GP or health visitor.



### We are an Operation Encompass School

For further information, please come and see us.



Our school participates in a Police led initiative called Operation Encompass. This is a partnership between schools and the Police that helps schools to better support any child where a domestic incident has been reported to Police from their home.

Following a domestic incident, the Police will contact the child's school via telephone and secure email (usually the next day) and will communicate relevant information to nominated, fully-trained school staff. This will ensure that as a school, we are made aware early enough, to support children and young people in a way that means they feel safe, supported and listened to. It will also provide an opportunity for school to offer support to the whole family

Each school has two members of staff called key adults who are trained to liaise with the police, when required, whilst ensuring support is available to the child. These will be Dominique Griffiths, Principal and Designated Safeguarding Lead, and Tina Brittain, Family Support Worker and Designated Safeguarding Lead.

The initiative was launched county-wide at the beginning of 2016. It is active in all Cheshire schools. You can find out more about Operation Encompass via the following site: <u>http://www.operationencompass.org/.</u>
