<u>The Hub</u>

The children have been exploring the Techcard resources this week and used these to create 3D shapes. Once the 3D structures had been built, the children added axles and wheels to create moving vehicles. Some children were able to expanded on their designs to add seats and a roof.













<u>Nursery</u>

This week in nursery we have been learning all about shapes! We practised identifying the different shapes and learning their names. The children listened very carefully to the shape name before jumping into the correct shape. Then, we told our friends which shape we were stood in.







Reception

This week in PSHE, we have been learning about different food groups and discussing heathy eating. We thought about the different jobs that these different foods do for our body for example; protein helps our muscles to grow, dairy products make our bones and teeth stronger, fruit and vegetables make us healthy all over. We talked about how important it is to remember to eat throughout the day, and not to forget breakfast! In Free Flow, the children created their own tally charts to find out Reception's favourite fruit.



Year 1

On Monday Year 1 were visited by Martyn, an aerobatics enthusiast, who came to show the children his gliders. He explained how they were made, and then flew one of them over the school field. We found out about the Wright Brothers and how they have influenced the aviation industry.



Year 2

Year 2 have had a fantastic week in DT this week making bug houses. They made their first design, tested the product and then improved it. We hope they collect lots of interesting bugs at home!



Year 3

This week in Science, Year 3 began to learn about how shadows are formed. We used a mixture of opaque and transparent objects to try and create shadows.



Year 4

This week, Year 4 have been learning about 'Seasonal Ingredients'. We first discovered what this means and then investigated some winter vegetables. Following this, we designed and created a vegetable bake for a child or adult.







Year 5

This week, Year 5 have been learning about burgers and how to make them. We have tested different flavours to decide what our individual burgers will be made from. Some of the children surprised themselves with the flavours they preferred. We were proud to see all of the children trying new ingredients. Both classes constructed their burgers and enjoyed them with chips during lunchtime on Wednesday. We look forward to seeing pictures of the ones created at home.



Year 6

As part of our History unit, Year 6 have been learning about rationing. On Friday, the children made the National Loaf – the only bread that was available during World War II. We tasted it fresh and when it was a few days old because bakers were not allowed to slice the bread until it was slightly stale so that they could cut the bread in to very thin slices in order to make it last longer. The children enjoyed the bread mostly, though it was quite salty! Some even tried it with a dip of Marmite!

Logging on for just a few minutes each day will make a massive difference to their basic number/times tables skills.









Some sounds are made at the front of the mouth e.g. p, t, d,s,f Using a dummy makes it hard to say these sounds Dummies should be gently withdrawn between 6 and 12 months to avoid possible longer-term problems such as: ear infections misalignment of teeth speech sound difficulties excessive drooling

Using a dummy during waking or playing hours could prevent a baby from babbling, which is an important step in learning to talk
