# The Hub

Our literacy theme this half-term is Percy the Park Keeper. We have been learning about his adventures and the animals that he looks after. One of those animals is a hedgehog and it is this character who has inspired our art lesson this week. The children have worked with salt dough to create model hedgehogs complete with spikes and eyes.















#### **Nursery**

This week we have been learning about the number four. We have been working very hard to practise our counting skills. After researching a very cold place called Antarctica we enjoyed counting the different small world animals that live there. We collected four penguins, four seals and four orca whales.







## **Reception**

This week the children have been learning about Mass and Capacity. We have been exploring how we can weigh objects using balance scales to find out if objects were heavier, lighter or equal weight. We loved experimenting this week to find out how much weight it would take to sink our boat.









#### Year 1

This week, we have looked at how Lego has changed. We found out that Lego became popular after they invented the 'clutch power'. We were then able to look at clutch power in more detail by using some Lego.









# Year 2

As part of our learning on climate change, we found out about the work of the WWF. We decided that we wanted to support the work that they do so we have chosen to adopt a panda!

Year 3 had a fantastic time at assembly learning about the importance of water and how we can look after it.



## Year 4

This week, year 4 were very lucky to experience some up close encounters with a variety of animals. We were introduced to some insects, reptiles and birds and learnt lots of interesting facts about each of them which allow us to classify them in our science lessons. 'Bob' the boa-constrictor was 2 meters long and 2 stone in weight and some of us were brave enough to stroke him.













# Year 5

Year 5 thoroughly enjoyed the United Utilities, Water Cycle, assembly on Monday morning. The children enjoyed seeing how water changed state and were particularly entertained by the dry ice. They left the assembly inspired and ready to use and save efficiently.







#### Year 6

In Science, Simon to visit us with a variety of animals. Using these creatures, he explained how a small adaptation a living thing experiences can enable it to become better suited to its environment. Did you know, snakes used to have four legs and boas and constrictors still have two legs! These adaptations have allowed these animals to evolve and change so that they do not die out.

We saw hissing cockroaches, a horsefield tortoise, a boa constrictor, owls, giant African snails and a hawk.

We will be using the amazing knowledge we gained from Science to inform our next piece of Literacy writing.










## **Art News**
