Nursery

This week in Nursery, we have started looking at our book The Little Red Hen. First, we looked at a surprise egg and tried to guess what is inside the egg. Next, we drew some pictures of the egg and some of our ideas. Then, we had a Stay and Play with our adults and took part in some egg themed activities.









Reception

This week, we have been learning about the seasons, focusing on Spring. The children explored what Spring looks like, what the weather is like and what happens in Spring. We compared Spring to other seasons such as Autumn and Winter. We had a walk to Queen's Park to observe the changes in Spring for example; the long grass, blossom on the trees, daffodils and flowers beginning to bloom and birds building nests. The children were nature detectives and completed a Spring Scavenger Hunt whilst at the park.







Year 1

To start our new topic all about growing, this week we have been having lots of fun planting different seeds. We learnt how to look after them and over the next few weeks we are going to watch them grow before adding them to our garden.











Year 2

Today, Year 2 had lots of fun planting some different seeds. We are hoping to grow carrots as well as lots of different flowers. We also planted some strawberry plants. Over the next few weeks, we will be looking after our growing area and watching what happens.









Year 3

As part of our Literacy unit on Apes we drew our own apes and chimps as a hook into our topic. We had lots of fun analysing the shapes and the colours of different apes and the similarities they have to us!







Year 4

As part of our RE unit on Islam, some members of the school Muslim community prepared an Islamic style feast for us to enjoy. This included many of the foods which the families would have eaten during their Eid celebrations. The food was delicious and we all enjoyed trying it. We would like to say a huge Thank You to everyone involved.



Year 5

This half term, we are embarking on a journey to the Amazon Rainforest. Our children will be immersed in the story, The Explorer, in literacy and will be writing many exciting narratives about discovery and survival. We will be sending home copies of the book and hope that you will spend some time enjoying this with your child.

This learning will also link with our history topic, Mayans, and the discovery of ancient ruins. If you can support your child in finding extra information about this civilisation, we'd love to hear what they have researched and learnt.


Focus on Year 5: Art Bytes Competition

In the news this week

A new artwork, from the mysterious street artist Banksy, appeared in North London overnight in March. The artwork shows green paint sprayed on a wall behind a cut-back tree to look like greenery, with a stencil of a person holding a spray can next to it. In the days following its creation, it was covered with plastic and surrounded by wooden boards to protect it. The local council, Islington, has added a frame around the site, which has plastic panels to allow people to view the artwork, whilst ensuring its protection.
