The Hubs

The children in Hub 3 have been learning about the annual cycle of seasons this week. They know that there are 4 seasons in a year and they can order them correctly. As part of their Literacy task this week they had to match a selection of pictures to the correct season. Every child was able to complete this independently and was very confident in their choices.











Nursery

This week we met a farmer in our story world. The children have been working hard to learn more about farming. We have been planting flowers, watering our vegetables, reading non-fiction books and washing farm animals in our water tray!







Reception

This week in Story world, we met Albert who has recently retired. His friends have encouraged him to start an allotment but he does not know where to start. His friend, Lianne, came to visit us to share pictures of her allotment and she answered any of our questions.









This week we have been planting seeds to grow some vegetables in our year 1 garden. We started by writing a set of instructions on how to plant the seeds, before planting them in little pots. We then learnt how we can look after them to help them grow, which we will observe over the next half term.



Year 2

To start our new Topic, Let's Grow, Year 2 had lots of fun planting some different seeds. We are hoping to grow carrots as well as different flowers. We also planted some strawberry plants. Over the next few weeks, we will be looking after our growing area and watching what happens.







This week in Year 3 Literacy, we have been discovering our new book The Scarab's Secret. We started our learning by making scarab beetle amulets out of clay which was lots of fun!















Year 4

This week, we were visited by the Wonderful Wizard of Words who gave us 'immigration', 'hunger' and 'change'. We then opened the clues to our new text, 'The Matchbox Diary'. They were a set of matchboxes, each containing a different object. As a class, we used the words and clues to discuss what our story could be about before reading it together.



This week, we have been hooked into our learning by uncovering clues and new vocabulary for our literacy topic: The Explorer. We created tableus to represent the different parts of Fred's journey.









On Wednesday, we took part in a fantastic workshop that was led by a professional actor. She taught us the basic plot of the famous Shakespeare play, a Midsummer's Night Dream. During the workshop, we were able to bring the story to life using words and actions. At the end of the session, we had a greater understanding of the characters, their traits and the clever way in which Shakespeare created the complex, yet fun, love story. We loved all of the plot twists and left feeling really enthused about our new unit of work.






Sports Day 2025

Our annual sports day event will take place on Friday 23rd May. The Reception and KS1 event will be starting at 9.30am and the KS2 event will be starting at 1.30pm. As in previous years we will have a parent and carer spectator area available; you are more than welcome to come along to support your children.

As the UEFA European Women's Championship is taking place this year In Switzerland, we thought it would be nice for the children to be in teams which represent some of the countries taking part. These counties have been selected by our Sports Ambassadors. Children have been divided into the following teams to encourage a small element of competition. The team names are Switzerland (red), Wales (green), Belgium (yellow) Italy (blue). Children should come to school in Sports Day Kit (black shorts, teams coloured t-shirt).



In the case of hot, sunny weather your child must wear a sun hat and sun cream. Please also ensure that your child has a bottle of water to take out with them onto the field. If sports day has to be postponed because of bad weather we will inform you asap.

Club places

If there is a high demand for certain clubs, we will look to ensure all children who wish to go to the club, but do not get a place this term, have the opportunity to attend the club at some point across the school year.

Below are the conditions that we will be following to keep our clubs process fair and consistent.

- If you would like your children to sign up for a club we recommend that you sign up on the day that the clubs go live. If you have been unsuccessful please make sure you pop in to the office and place your child on the waiting list.
- If you have been successful, please ensure your child is aware that the club will run for the whole half term and they are expected to attend each week.
- If your child no longer wants to attend it is your responsibility to contact the office to inform them that your child no longer wants a place. This way we can remove your child from the register and add someone from the waiting list.
- If your child does not attend for **2 consecutive weeks** (without reason) you will then be contacted and your child will be automatically removed to allow someone from the waiting list to attend.

If your child has a space, we expect them to follow the school rules outlined in our behaviour policy during club. If your child displays disruptive behaviour you will be informed and their place will be removed.

Weather

The school has worked hard to invest in an all-weather Astroturf so that your children can participate in sports all year round. This does mean that if it is raining during clubs such as football and dodgeball that clubs will continue to run on the all- weather pitch. Please make sure your child has the appropriate clothing i.e. coat, trousers, jumpers so that we can continue to offer high quality sports clubs.

If you do not wish for your child to participate when it is raining it is your responsibility to collect them at 3.15pm.

Sports clothing

Please ensure that your child has the correct clothing for their after-school club. If the club is run outside then jumpers, joggers and coats are needed. If your child participates in football we are asking if they can bring trainers as well as football boots (if they have them). Football boots will only be worn if the club is taking place on the field as we are no longer able to use studs on the all-weather pitch.

Please ensure that ALL children are collected from clubs outside the main reception on time. If children are not collected from clubs on time they will be taken to Wizz Kids and will need to be collected from there. You will be charged for their time in Wizz Kids.

Maths News


