






#### Year 1

This week in History, we created some lovely art to show the importance of The River Nile to the people of ancient Egypt.






#### Year 4

This week, the children were tasked with the challenge of making a light bulb light up, without being shown how. Many were successful very quickly, so moved on to trying to make the bulb light without the bulb holder. Then they sketched a diagram of their circuit in their books.













#### Year 5

Last week, we were visited by a team of fire fighters from Cheshire Fire and Rescue Service. We watched a range of informative videos which helped us to understand what to do in the event of a house fire. We discussed many different scenarios and strategies to escape in each scenario. We recognised that fire alarms are essential to escaping quickly and safely and we talked about how often to test that they are working. After the presentation, we went outside where we explored the different parts of the fire engine and the equipment they carry. We even entered the smoke tent where we had to drop to the floor to avoid inhaling smoke and crawl to the exit. This represented what we should do in the event of a fire.



#### Year 6

In this week's Literacy lesson, we have been working as a team to create descriptive phrases to describe the main characters Oberon, Titania and Puck. We then used role on the wall to record them. It worked really well, as we were armed with ideas to create descriptions sentences about the characters using a variety of rich and varied vocabulary.

#### **Maths News**


Fancy winning a £50 gift voucher!? Take part in the Number Heroes competition.
