<u>Year 1</u>

This week as part of our learning all about plants, Year 1 carried out a survey around the school. We found out about common plants that grow in England and then looked to see if we could find them in our school area. At the end of our plant survey the children picked a dandelion and a daisy so that they could really look at the similarities and differences between these flowers.



Year 2

This week, we went to investigate a local woodland habitat. We looked at our school on a map and plotted a route that would take us to the nearest woodland. When we were there, we looked for different plants that were growing in the woodland and thought about the conditions that they were adapted to.











Year 3



After, we created a freeze frame within our groups to represent the key moment from the scene.




Year 5
