The Hubs

Buoyancy was the theme of this week's Science lesson. The children explored this concept through a practical activity with model boats. They found that they could affect the buoyancy of a boat by adding weight to it; if there was too much weight added or if it was added unevenly, then the boat would sink.

Reception

At the end of last week, we had a visit from Ali from the RSPCA as part of British Hedgehog Awareness week. We thought about the life cycle of a hedgehog and its habitat, made our own clay hedgehogs and were given a magazine each to take home.









Year 1

This week in DT year 1 we completed some research to find out about where different fruit comes from when it is not in season in the UK. After our research, we sampled different products to decide which fruits we would like to go into our fruit crumble. We then learnt to cut using the bridge method, fork support and claw grip. We assembled our ingredients and added the crumble on top ready for them to be cooked, tasted and evaluated.







Year 2

This term, the children have been learning about how our body works and understanding the different body parts. After exploring what happens to their heart and lungs by walking on the spot, star-jumping and jogging on the spot they were then able to explain why they breathed harder and why their hearts beat faster.









Year 3

This week, Year 3 have had lots of fun using Scratch to code an underwater scene.

















Year 4

This week, Year 4 experimented with conductors and insulators. The lesson was full of surprises, such as a pipe cleaner and a water bottle conducting electricity successfully!

We have been using our translating skills to understand what the French sentences mean in English. We were then able to match the sentences to the correct pictures.



Year 6







