National Numeracy Day

In celebration of this year's National Numeracy Day, the children have taken part in an exciting Magic Story Box activity. As we have been exploring money in maths, we thought that a trip to a 'shop' would be a great way to practise our counting and exchanging skills. It was great fun and the children came back with lots of treats!









Nursery

This week we been looking after TEN chicks. Throughout the week we ensured the chicks had enough food and water. At the end of the week we had a special visitor! We had a visit from farmer Dave. He brought four calves and a tractor!







Reception

This week in our magic story box sessions, we met a boy called George who loves to explore the outdoors and wants to be a master bug collector. We helped George by going on our own mini beast scavenger hunt around the school grounds. We made tally marks to show the different mini beasts we had found.

We have also enjoyed singing lots of mini beast songs such as incy wincy spider and there's a worm at the bottom of the garden. At the end of the week, we helped to create a bug habitat in our nature spot outdoor.







Year 1

This week, we have been doing lots of work on the story 'The Something' By Rebecca Cobb. We looked at props to give us clues about the story, and our teachers took on the role of a character, so that we could ask the character lots of questions. To further enhance our learning, we have also engaged in drama activities such as acting out the story in a strategy we call the 'story stick'.



Year 2

This week, we have looked at the results of our experiment that we set up at the beginning of the half term. We have concluded that the plants needed a little bit of water each day. The plant with no water died and the plant with lots of water did grow but it didn't look very healthy. We put this information onto a graph using Purple Mash.







Year 3

In science, we have been learning all about the parts of a flower so we very carefully dissected a rose.





















Year 4

Today, we created a simple circuit and then challenged ourselves to make our own switches. We did this using cardboard and pins. We folded the cardboard to make the pins touch. When they touched the bulb lit up and when they weren't touching it switched off.







Year 5

We tried some experiments to see what it would be like if we were older. We had to wear plastic around our hands and try to write, wrap bandages around of knees and bend down, wear glasses which were blurry and wear ear defenders and see what it might be like to hear.



Year 6

This week, Year 6 began their Field to Fork project. This engaging initiative will give pupils the chance to explore where food comes from, design their own food products and learn about a variety of careers linked to the food industry. As part of this project, they visited Wimboldsley Grange Farm on Wednesday. Pupils had a brilliant time learning how the farm operates, the types of food produced there and the various careers available in agriculture. They visited the milking parlour, explored locally grown wheat and even got to sit in all of the tractors!

A vehicle once used by Pope Francis to wave and greet people-called a popemobile-is being turned into a mobile health clinic for children in Gaza. Pope Francis, who recently passed away, was the head of the Catholic Church and often spoke about helping others. One of his final wishes was to help children affected by the conflict in Gaza. The vehicle will be refitted with medical equipment, as found in ambulances, so it can be used to aid children in areas where hospitals may be hard to reach. The project aims to deliver essential medical care to those who need it.

Maths News


