


#### **Reception**







#### Art News

#### Y4B swimming



All children from 4B will be going swimming after Easter as part of the compulsory national PE curriculum. The sessions will begin on the afternoon of **Tuesday 10<sup>th</sup> June and will finish on Tuesday 15<sup>th</sup> July 2025.** 

The children will be travelling, by mini bus, to the Crewe Lifestyle Centre, accompanied by members of the Year 4 team. Your child will need to bring in their swimming costume/shorts and a towel. If your child forgets their kit, we will contact you during the morning to try to arrange for their kit to be dropped off. Children are not allowed to wear any jewellery in the pool, so all must be removed before they enter. Please ensure that all earrings are removed before children come to school, if the children cannot remove the earrings themselves. In addition, long hair must be tied up.

If your child has a medical condition which prevents them from swimming, they will require a signed doctor's note; otherwise they will be expected to swim. If your child has a one-off medical condition on one of their swimming sessions, then please speak directly to their class teacher, or send in a signed note. We will not accept the children's reasons for why they are missing swimming, without confirmation from an adult.
