

The children have been thinking about how to keep themselves safe this half term, and this week we explored this further through the Pantosaurus and the Power of Pants book. This book was published by the NSPCC as a way of sparking conversations about consent, good and bad secrets and knowing who you can speak to if you need help. With this in mind, the children have created their own 'Pants of Power' featuring lots of their favourite things.

Year 1

This week in topic we created our own summer tree inspired by Claude Monet who was born in 1840. We started by painting the tree trunks and branches by using soft strokes, before we got our own paint palettes and added our leaves by carefully mixing colours to create different shades.



Year 2

This week in Year 2, we have had great fun making bread as part of our DT topic. First, we sampled a range of bread products and rated the bread. We used this information to help us to think about how we want our bread to be. We then made our dough as a team. Once the dough had proved, we made it into individual portions and choose our toppings. After they were cooked, we tasted our bread to see if it had achieved the design criteria.











Year 3

This week, year 3 read the book Me...Jane which is about the life of Jane Goodall. They used different drama techniques to think more about her life and are now writing their own stories about her!







Year 4

This Week, the children created and tested an outfit designed to slow a runner down with increased air resistance. The wind was quite high and many of them encountered structural difficulties with their constructions, but they were all very resilient and did their best to adapt in the moment.

Last week we went to Liverpool on the train and explored the World Museum and Walker Art Gallery. We stopped at the library and explored the different books that they had.
