
#### <u>Hubs</u>

In Hub 2, children have been practising colour matching and counting to 5.









#### **Nursery**

This week the children have enjoyed exploring both the indoor and outdoor environment alongside their peers. They have been working hard to learn our nursery 'Rainbow Rules' and have been helping each other to tidy-up when they have finished.







#### **Reception**

The children have settled beautifully into Reception, learning the school rules and routines. We have had lots of fun exploring our new environment and making new friends.









#### Year 1

This week in RE we have been learning about Christianity. We learnt many Christians believe God created the world. We shared and discussed the creation story. Then we used 'Story Stick' to re-tell the story.







#### Year 2

This week, we learnt to name some of the common coastal features. With our partner we went on a hunt around the room to see which features we could find using guided tour.









#### Year 3

This week in Science we explored different rocks using magnifying glasses. We then sorted the rocks into categories, including hard and soft. Finally we recorded our findings by creating a detailed drawing of one of the rocks.







#### Year 4

This week, we introduced our new science topic – Sound! We learnt about how sounds are caused by vibrations. We had lots of fun investigating sound waves and vibrations by trying to move grains of rice with sound. Using a bowl and some clingfilm, we made different noises to see if the sound vibrations would make the rice jump! We tried keeping the clingfilm tight and loose and seeing if this affected the sound – which it did! Then we had a variety of instruments to investigate how the sound was being made. We found there were lots of different ways we could make sounds by plucking, hitting, shaking and blowing them. We noticed what was vibrating and how the sound was made.







#### Year 5

In science, we used torches and globes to demonstrate how day and night happens. We could see the different countries that have day time, whilst other countries had night.



#### Year 6

In Music this week, we were learning how to keep a beat whilst playing in time to the song Happy by Pharrell Williams. We learnt how to play the notes A, G and B on a glockenspiel whilst playing in time to the song.





#### **Art News**

Year 6 have been completing some incredible self-portraits that we began in Year 5. We were inspired by the amazing, emotive portraits created by artist Agnes Cecile. As well as thinking about areas for shading, we used our expressions and colour choices to convey different emotions in our pictures. A church in Kiruna, which is one of Sweden's largest wooden buildings, has been carefully moved 5km to a new location. Many buildings in the city are being relocated because the ground is unstable due to iron ore mining. The church, built in 1912 and voted Sweden's most beautiful pre-1950 building, was slowly transported on special trailers. The process was watched by thousands of people.

#### **Maths News**

All children from Reception through to KS2 have access to an app called **Numbots.** This fantastic app supports children with their number fluency, allowing them to use efficient mental calculation strategies to add/subtract, so they don't rely on using their fingers!

If your child is in KS2 they will also have access to an app called **Times Table Rocks Stars (TTRS)**, which supports knowledge of times tables and therefore builds confidence in multiplication and division.

Evidence tells us that logging on for **just a few minutes each day** will make a massive difference to their number fluency/times tables skills.
